CLASS INFORMATION

COURSE FOCUS:	Four Skills focusing on Oral Communication
ENGLISH LEVEL:	Mostly Elementary but possibility of higher levels from English immersion pre-schools in the same class.
GRADE:	2nd to 5th *In the 1st grade, the students are 6/7 years old.
CLASS SIZE:	Approx. 12 students per class
LESSON LENGTH:	25 minutes per lesson
NUMBER OF LESSONS:	Up to 4 lessons a day
NUMBER OF LESSONS PER CLASS: (i.e. how many times you teach a particular group of students per week)	Five times a week
TEACHING STYLE:	Communicative lessons. The instructor will be teaching the students alone (no Japanese teacher or staff member will be in the classroom with the instructor). Solid classroom management skills and an engaging teaching style are necessary.
MATERIALS:	The program requires the use of many materials such as song CDs, picture books, flashcards, and handouts. Most of these materials are prepared by Westgate to assist instructors' teaching.

STUDENT EVALUATION

The instructor is responsible for assessing each student using the evaluation system developed by Westgate.
